The seminar was hosted by IBA-ADRIC, in collaboration with the Commercial Law Development Program (CLDP), U.S. Department of Commerce.

Secretary of Law and Justice Commission, Pakistan, Ms. Riffat Inam presented a special address where she emphasized the practices that Pakistan is adopting for the promotion of ADR in Pakistan. It was discussed that the Supreme Court has formed an active ADR task force the members of which are working diligently in promulgating a legal framework for mediation and ADR in Pakistan.

In his keynote address, Hon'ble Justice, Lahore High Court, Jawad Hassan highlighted that Pakistan is on the right track in adopting ADR practices.

Hon'ble Senior Puisne Justice, Supreme Court of Pakistan, Syed Mansoor Ali Shah commented on the ADR Renaissance theme and enlightened that various industries can be deduced under ADR for effective dispute resolution. He expressed that Pakistan should focus on keeping ADR as a desired dispute resolution mechanism.

Justice Attique Shah informed the audience about the significance of ADR and its effective impact on reducing the caseload of the judiciary. He also emphasized the legal provisions of the ADR Act and their significance.

Hon'ble Chief Justice, Sindh High Court, Muhammad Shafi Siddique stressed the importance of focusing on all forms of ADR, not just mediation, especially given Pakistan's significant case backlog.

The seminar concluded with closing remarks that reiterated the importance of ADR in Pakistan's legal landscape.



SMCS HOSTS SEMINAR ON 'AN INTRODUCTION TO TOPOLOGICAL QUANTUM FIELD THEORY (TQFT) - PART ONE'

SMCS hosted a seminar as part of the Basic Notions Seminar Series titled 'An Introduction to Topological Quantum Field Theory (TQFT) -Part One'. The talk featured Dr. Azeem Hassan, Assistant Professor, SMCS, who presented an engaging dialogue on TQFT.

The session provided a comprehensive overview of TQFTs, which are essential in the exploration of quantum field theories that can be fully axiomatized. Dr. Azeem discussed the significance of TQFTs in classifying low-dimensional theories, their application in geometry for discovering manifold invariants, and their crucial role in physics, particularly in describing the low-energy limits of quantum field theories. Additionally, the talk delved into the generalizations of Atiyah's axioms, offering deep insights into both the mathematical and physical aspects of TQFTs.



CLIMATE CRISIS AND IMPACT ON LABOR AND PEASANT LIVELIHOOD - A PANEL BY SBS

SBS hosted a thought-provoking panel discussion on the 'Climate Crisis and Impact on Labor and Peasant Livelihood' to address the escalating climate crisis, which is profoundly affecting communities worldwide, with laborers and peasants among the most vulnerable.

The discussion focused on the multifaceted impacts of climate change and explored ways to mitigate these effects and adapt to the changing environment.



WORKSHOP ON THE 'STRUCTURE OF UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION'

LAUNCH OF DISTRICT EDUCATION PERFORMANCE INDEX REPORT 2023

SESS recently hosted the launch of the District Education Performance Index (DEPIx) Report 2023, led by Mr. Rafiullah Kakar, a Social Sector & Devolution member at the Planning Commission. The discussion was moderated by Dr. Asma Hyder, Dean of SESS, with Ms. Shereen Narejo, Secretary of Planning and Development, Government of Sindh, and Dr. Muhammad Nasir, Chairperson of the Department of Economics, as key discussants. The launch sparked insightful discussions between faculty and students on how data-driven reforms can shape future education policy.

The complexity, breadth, and fragmentation of education data have often made it challenging for policymakers and stakeholders to use it effectively in decision-making. To address this issue, the Planning Commission has integrated various school education indicators into composite scorecards. The objective is to make data available in a form that can be easily understood and utilized by policymakers and other stakeholders to inform advocacy, policy planning, and resource allocation in school education. DEPIx is a comprehensive tool that measures the performance of education systems at the district level, focusing on key outcomes such as access, learning, and equity, processes such as governance, and inputs like public financing and infrastructure.



REVISITING NARRATIVES: NATIONHOOD, PUBLIC MEMORY, URBANITY AND LABOURING LIVES - IBA-SSLA ORGANIZED 1ST DEPARTMENTAL CONFERENCE



The Department of Social Sciences and Liberal Arts (SSLA), at SESS, in collaboration with IBA-CBER, organized its first departmental conference titled 'Revisiting Narratives: Nationhood, Public Memory, Urbanity and Labouring Lives' at the Main Campus.

The conference brought together seasoned and emerging scholars, field practitioners, government representatives, and university students to initiate a dialogue on revisiting global and local narratives that shape our lives today. Panellists and participants were invited from across Pakistan and around the world.

Chairperson SSLA, Dr. Laila Sohail Farooq, welcomed the guests and attendees to the conference. Dr. Ravi Ahuja, Scholar of Modern Indian History based at Georg-August University Gottingen, delivered the keynote lecture titled 'Labour as a Political Category: Twentieth Century Trajectories in South Asia', in which he traced the evolution of the conceptual category of 'labour' and examined its potential as a political category in India and elsewhere in South Asia. He emphasized the need to expand the concept considering current socio-political and economic realities to reach and affect labouring lives both ideologically and materially.

The showcase included research and practice-based projects carried out by SSLA students in their courses: 'Critical Media Practice', 'Visual Methods in Urban Research', and 'Calligraphy', in addition to final year students' theses. Executive Director IBA, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, appreciated student effort and encouraged all guests in attendance to pay a visit.
