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IBA Karachi & Stanford Life Design Lab

Collaborate to Transform Pakistan's Educational Landscape



In a landmark event at Scotts Valley in California, IBA Karachi and Stanford University's Life Design Lab partnership was unveiled by the Director, Alumni Affairs, Resource Mobilization & Corporate Relations, IBA, Ms. Malahat Awan, and Assistant Professor, SBS, IBA, Mr. Azam Ali, setting the stage for a transformative shift in Pakistan's educational landscape. Through the application of design thinking, this collaboration aims to tackle Pakistan's educational challenges by focusing on sustainable, context-driven solutions, and fostering long-term growth and innovation.

The event featured an insightful panel discussion led by the Chief Minister of Sindh and Patron IBA, Syed Murad Ali Shah, who was joined by the Executive Director, IBA, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi; Executive Director, Stanford Life Design Lab, Mr. Bill Burnett; and Co-Founder of Designing Your Spiritual Life, Stanford Life Design Lab, Mr. Junaid Aziz. Their conversation explored the significance of this collaboration and how it brings globally renowned expertise to Pakistan while remaining deeply attuned to local realities.

A key takeaway from the panel discussion, emphasized by the Chief Minister, was the crucial role of IBA alumnus, who now serves as a senior faculty member at Stanford's Life Design Lab, Mr. Aziz's firsthand knowledge of IBA's context and Stanford's cutting-edge methodologies, acts as a pivotal link between the two institutions. The Chief Minister highlighted that this unique connection ensures that the collaboration is not just an academic exchange but a meaningful, locally relevant effort to address Pakistan's educational challenges. IBA alumni's dual understanding of Pakistan's specific needs and Stanford's innovative approaches was repeatedly underscored as a cornerstone of the partnership's success.

Throughout the dialogue, the Chief Minister stressed that this is not about implementing pre-packaged solutions but about Stanford's faculty immersing themselves in Pakistan's challenges to co-create solutions alongside IBA. He emphasized that the presence of Stanford experts at IBA's Karachi campus is vital to developing solutions that resonate with the local environment, driving home the importance of solving Pakistan's problems within its borders.

Echoing these sentiments, Mr. Burnett explained that he sees this collaboration as a reciprocal learning experience. Not only will Stanford contribute its expertise, but it will also draw inspiration from Pakistan's unique challenges. The transfer of knowledge, and this collaboration will enable IBA to serve as a hub for innovation, supporting the next generation of Pakistani leaders by equipping them with the tools to tackle complex societal issues through human-centred design.

Dr. Zaidi noted that this collaboration stands out because it is rooted in context and designed for long-term impact. By embedding this new pedagogy into the educational framework at IBA, the center will provide a space for nurturing innovation, testing ideas, and developing solutions that are both practical and sustainable.

The dialogue highlighted concrete plans to fast-track the integration of this innovative teaching process through faculty workshops, curriculum enhancements, and hands-on involvement from Stanford experts. The overarching goal is to ensure that IBA students start experiencing the transformative impact of this partnership immediately, equipping them with world-class skills that will position them as future leaders and innovators in Pakistan and beyond.

SBS & the Ministry of Energy (Power Division) kick off the 1st Pakistan Power Reforms Project Roundtable



SBS and the Ministry of Energy (Power Division) co-hosted the first keynote session for the Pakistan Power Reforms Project.

Honourable Federal Minister for Power, Sardar Awais Khan Leghari, delivered a keynote laying a roadmap for boosting the power sector's efficiency and driving industrial and economic growth.

The keynote was followed by a panel discussion featuring Minister Leghari, IBA's Executive Director, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, which Mr. Junaid Iqbal moderated.

The Minister emphasized that structural reforms are complex, with results expected in a few months. The Power Division is focused on enhancing governance in distribution companies and transforming transmission infrastructure to boost efficiency and reduce losses. Additionally, plans are underway to stimulate industrial demand and accelerate economic growth.

The event ended on a positive note, with a clear focus on a reform agenda that will result in improved governance standards, and better efficiency in the generation, transmission, and distribution of electricity – resulting in lower prices of electricity, which can trigger industrial, and economic growth in the process.

IBA Karachi & HEC collaborate to Propel Entrepreneurship with the 'I-INCUBATE' Program

IBA-CED launched 'I-INCUBATE', an incubation program supported by the Higher Education Commission (HEC) at the City Campus. The launch event was attended by personnel from the local entrepreneurial ecosystem.

This initiative formally establishes IBA's incubation program following a highly competitive process, further strengthening the Institution's commitment towards start-up innovation. The HEC-funded I-INCUBATE is a 13-month program offering structured training, dedicated mentoring, goal setting, accountability, networking, and co-working space amongst many other resources and facilities. The program aims to increase the sustainability of the selected student startups, empowering them to create a positive societal impact through innovation, job creation, income generation and economic growth while strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystem.



The event commenced with a welcome address by Dr. Lalarukh Ejaz, Director of IBA-CED, while a program overview was given by Ms. Kanza Sohail, Lead Incubation Program, followed by an introduction to the selected startups.

Printing Holy Texts

The Case of the Qur'an in Comparative Perspective' by Professor Roberto Tottoli – an SESS lecture

SESS hosted a lecture titled 'Printing Holy Texts: The Case of the Qur'an in Comparative Perspective' featuring Professor Roberto Tottoli at the City Campus. Students, faculty, historians and scholars attended the enlightening lecture.



Professor Tottoli, Rector of the University of Naples, L'Orientale, is an eminent Arabist, scholar of Islamic history and an expert in Arabic Qur'anic manuscript traditions as well as in the history of European Latin and vernacular translations of the Qur'an.

Executive Director, IBA Karachi, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi in his welcome remarks appreciated Professor Tottoli's expertise and invited him to discuss his research. Professor Tottoli explored early European printing of the Qur'an.



His research suggests that the first Qur'an was printed in Europe due to the technical expertise available and because of the strong European interest in the study of Arabic and Islam. The speaker argued that obstacles to early Qur'an printing in Europe had less to do with socio-economic and cultural factors, and more likely due to lack of familiarity with Arabic letters and their vowel markers and pauses. The complex script and lack of Arabic literacy posed problems with the accuracy and quality of printing.

He concluded the lecture by reminding the audience that the Qur'an is the most printed book in the world and that a contemporary history of the production of the printed Qur'an is a complex and rich topic of study.

IBA Hosts University of Essex Delegation to Explore Collaborative Initiatives

IRC at the IBA hosted a distinguished delegation from the University of Essex, to explore potential collaborative initiatives between the two institutions.

During the meeting, representatives discussed various collaboration opportunities, including student, faculty, and staff exchanges, research partnerships, joint teaching programs, and scholarship possibilities. The focus was on enhancing educational ties and broadening academic horizons for both institutions. As part of the collaboration, the IBA-IRC partnered with SESS and SMCS to host a series of guest lectures for IBA students.

Esteemed faculty from the University of Essex delivered insightful and engaging presentations. Professor Simon Weidenholzer spoke on 'Understanding Coordination Problems Using Game Theory,' while Dr. Joseph Bailey's session focused on 'From Predicting Netflix to Analyzing Animal Behaviour: Data Science at the University of Essex.'



Additionally, Dr. Laura Sudulich addressed the topic '2024 – A Big Year for Elections,' and Dr. Antonio Da Silva discussed 'Al in Language Teaching and Learning: Transforming TESOL for the Future.'






Trainings @ IBA - September 2024
